Notes:

1. You must pay an amount of income tax/capital gains tax at least equal to the tax that the club reclaims on your donation in the tax year (currently 28p for each £1 you give)
2. You can cancel this declaration at any time by notifying the club.
3. If in the future you no longer pay tax you can cancel this declaration.
4. If you are a higher rate taxpayer you can claim further tax relief in your self assessment tax return.
5. If you are unsure whether your donation qualifies for Gift Aid tax relief, ask the club, or your local tax office for leaflet IR65
6. Please notify the club if you change your address.

GIFT AID SCHEME - An explanation

The club in launching this scheme, is asking all members (and friends) to consider making a "Gift Aid" donation to the club's "Fighting Fund". All gifts made, will - if you are normally a tax payer, be eligible for a **28p in the £ rebate** from the Inland Revenue. That means that for every £100 we receive in gift aid, the Inland Revenue will also give us a further £28 (free - gratis).

You do not even need to be a member of the club for the club to benefit from the scheme.

Background:

The Red Rose Cave and Pothole Club was registered with the Inland Revenue as a: "**Community Amateur Sports Club**" in August 2004, which enables it to take advantage of special tax rules. i.e.

Tax Relief for the club:

1. Exemption from Corporation Tax on any trading profits and on any savings interest

Tax Relief for Donors:

1. Individuals can use "**Gift Aid**" to make donations, and if they are currently basic tax payers the club can reclaim basic rate income tax paid on the donation.
2. Individuals can also obtain relief from "**Inheritance Tax**" for any gifts made.
3. Businesses can give goods or equipment that they make, sell or use, and offset this against tax.
4. Gifts of "Chargeable Assets" by businesses or individuals are also treated as having exemption from Capital Gains Tax

Gift Aid and you:

If you are a taxpayer (and most of us are) you can make gifts to the club using "**Gift Aid**" the same way that you may do when donating to registered charities. "**Gift Aid**" relief is only available for gifts and not for annual subscriptions. **The club can reclaim basic rate income tax paid by you on your donation:-** no matter whether the gift is large or small, regular or as a one off. The club keeps a record of your donation and then each year claims:-

28p EXTRA FOR EVERY £1 YOU GIVE, FROM THE INLAND REVENUE.

What you need to do if you would like to help us:-

1. Please first fill in a "**Gift Aid Declaration**" and sign it. We cannot claim the rebate without the form.
2. Then, either make a donation now, and send it to the address given overleaf, together with the "Gift Aid" form. or, make your donation at a later date.
- Please ensure you tell us then that it is: "Gift Aid".
3. Or, tell the Treasurer (*or the Gift Aid Co-ordinator*) that you wish to donate "Gift Aid" through your bank or building society. We will then provide you with details on how to do this.

We hope you feel you can support us at this crucial time.
